Regarded by many as Jean-Pierre Melville's gangster masterpiece, there's a sense of existential dread about this austere and stylish film noir of a lonely Parisian contract killer (Alain Delon) living by the samurai's bushido code. Admired by many film directors, *Le Samourai*'s influence can be found in Scorsese's *Taxi Driver*, Coppola's *The Conversation*, Tarantino's *Reservoir Dogs*, Bertolucci's *The Conformist*, Michael Mann's *Heat*, Jim Jarmusch's *Ghost Dog: The Way of the Samurai*, and almost all of Takeshi Kitano's films. Remakes include John Woo's *The Killer*, Anton Corbijn's *The American* and Nicolas Winding Refn's *Drive*. Long difficult to see on a cinema screen, these will be the first Australian screenings of the new Ultra High Definition 4K restoration.

LANGUAGE ENGLISH Cinema Reborn presents the World Premiere of this 4K restoration of one of the greatest screwball comedies of the 1930s. Billy Wilder and Charles Brackett's laceratingly funny script takes aim at European aristocrats, fashion trends and the ostentatious rich while exploring the frictions between wealth and love. Claudette Colbert plays an unemployed, gold-digging American showgirl stranded in a Parisian rainstorm, when she meets an amorous Hungarian taxi driver (Don Ameche). Gate-crashing a party held by a socialite (Hedda Hopper), she meets a wealthy industrialist (John Barrymore) who hires her to pose as an American wife married to a Hungarian Baron. This ruse, the industrialist hopes, will help break up an affair between his wife (Mary Astor) and a wealthy playboy (Francis Lederer). Conning each other as best they can, these characters all end up in the industrialist's Versailles chateau, where the swindles and the fun ramp up to another level.

Lovers Bill and Abby pretend to be brother and sister so that Abby can marry the terminally ill farmer and inherit his fortune. Most of the film was shot during the Golden Hour, the brief time after sunrise and before sunset, so revered by cinematographers. The result earned Nestor Almendros an Academy Award for Best Cinematography and is regarded as one of the most beautiful films ever made. Terrence Malick was awarded Best Director at Cannes. Antonioni's fifth feature was his first to demonstrate the distinctive style and content that would become the signature of his illustrious career. Aldo (Steve Cochran) has lost the woman he loves to somebody else, and feeling excluded from life, wanders through damp and desolate Po Valley landscapes, reflecting on his emotional loss. Unlike his future films, Antonioni's main character is working class rather than middle class and Penelope Houston sees Aldo as "the sort of character who would rather sit suffering in the rain than walk to a shelter". Sheriff John Chance (John Wayne) holds a killer in jail and waits for a United States Marshal to come to his border-town of Rio Bravo. The prisoner's family and hired guns start besieging the town and the jail. Chance's helpers are his ex-deputy Dude (Dean Martin), now the town drunk; a cantankerous old cripple Stumpy (Walter Brennan): a voung hotshot gunfighter Colorado (Ricky Nelson); and a passing gambler known as Feathers (Angie Dickinson). It's based in a small town in the West after the pioneers have left - all stagecoaches, hotel owners, sheriffs, deputies, farmers, gamblers and hired guns. In the 1930s and 1940s Olive Cotton helped run a photographic studio in Sydney with her childhood friend and first husband Max Dupain. During that time, her own work was exhibited locally and internationally. After World War II, she remarried, moved to Koorawatha in central NSW where she lived without water and electricity while struggling to survive and raise a family. Too poor to print her photographs, the negatives were stored in a sea chest until the 1960s when friends and family helped her build a darkroom in Cowra. She spent much of the rest of her life printing from her archives.

Soulyemane Cissé's extraordinary winner of the Cannes Jury Prize is regarded as one of greatest achievements of African cinema. Set in Mali in the 13th Century, it uses the Bambara people's magic realist belief in time as circular - not linear - always returning to the yeelen (the brightness) that created the world. Based on an ancient oral legend, a sorcerer has to escape his jealous shaman father, who fears the magical powers of his son. Travelling across the Mali landscape in search of spiritual enlightenment, he studies the mysteries of the gods; encounters a hyena that tells him he will end a curse; and uses a swarm of bees to defeat a local tribe.

Three refugees, representing three generations of Palestinians dispossessed of their homeland, meet in Irag in 1958 to find safe passage to the 'promised land' of Kuwait, Filmed entirely in Syria, The Dupes is directed by an Egyptian social realist filmmaker and based on the 1963 novel Men in the Sun by Ghassan Kanafani, the eminent Palestinian refugee, writer and political activist. The three refugees are played by non-professional actors from Syria and Palestine adding to the film's heightened social realist style. Only available for decades in very poor, virtually unwatchable copies, Scorsese's Film Foundation and the Cineteca de Bologna finally accessed the film elements in Syria and debuted this 4K restoration in Bologna last vear.

Sopyonje was the first Korean film seen by over one million people in Seoul, and the major Korean international festival hit of the 1990s. KOREAN SHOWCASE: THE FILMS OF IM KWON-TAEK

Korean director Im Kwon-taek (b. 1936) made over 100 features in a career made resonant with local box office hits, yet he still broke-through local censorship taboos, gained break-out international film festival invitations and received western critical attention for Korean cinema, inspiring South Korea's current generation of international art house film making superstars.

Our 2024 festival screenings of *Sopyonje* in Sydney and Melbourne begin a short, followup season (in Sydney only) showcasing some of Im's other key films, as well as the dynamic cinema restoration program of the Korean national film archive KOFA (see Webinar below).

The Sydney season includes *Ticket* (1986), a look at the struggles and triumphs of rural South Korea's coffee house hostesses, one of Im's key, empathetic cycle of 'woman's pictures' of the late 1980s; and *Mandala* (1980), his milestone and, in his own words, first 'honest' feature, a Buddhist 'road movie' following two priests on an unlikely path to spiritual enlightenment in modern industrialised South Korea.
